

Introduction


During the Imagine Kalamazoo 2025 (IK2025) planning process, neighborhood plans were identified as a need. Neighborhood plans allow the neighborhood to focus on their neighborhood vision and realize the community's Strategic Vision with small-scale or focused planning work. This resident driven process allows neighborhoods to take control of their future. The neighborhood planning process, as laid out in the 2025 Master Plan, does not have a required focus beyond aligning with the Strategic Vision and 2025 Master Plan goals. Through this process, residents are encouraged to think about everything that impacts their daily wellbeing and future. The resulting plans are comprehensive and leverage collaboration to achieve results.

East Main Street Corridor Plan

The East Main Corridor Plan was created in 2008 by Williams and Works. Due to the Recession, this plan was never implemented. Many of the same issues addressed in that plan remain today. The recommendations from this plan heavily influenced the commercial goals set forth in the 2018 Neighborhood Plan.

Quality of Life Plan

The Quality of Life Plan was created by E-Net. The purpose of this plan was to "create a blueprint that will improve the quality of life in the neighborhood." It covers everything from building a stronger sense of community to business development. Many of the goals from this plan were carried forward to the 2018 Neighborhood Plan.



The Eastside Neighborhood began its planning process by recognizing past planning efforts such as the East Main Street Corridor Plan (2008), which has a focus on the main commercial corridor in the neighborhood, and the ENet Quality of Life Plan (2014), which focused on community building, youth and housing. Upon reviewing these plans, it was determined that many of the goals and actions in them were still relevant. This, combined with Eastside Neighborhood IK2025 input, provided a clear starting point for neighborhood discussions.

To confirm that what was heard during past planning efforts, ENET and KENA held a community meeting. Nearly 40 residents attended, providing some new ideas, confirming priorities, and learning more about some of the efforts happening in the area. That information was used to draft goals and actions to work toward the Eastside that residents envisioned. From June through August, the goals and draft plan were made available for community review and comment online, at KENA, and during popup engagement. This effort has resulted in the Imagine Eastside Plan.

Housing

VISION: Eastside is a neighborhood that provides multiple housing options for all residents and prioritizes accessibility and affordability.

Create More Affordable Housing Options and Opportunity for Homeownership

Residents have noted that Eastside housing stock is single family homes that are full of character and that at least half of it is 80 years old. Residents want more affordable housing in the neighborhood and a greater variety of options. It is important to the neighborhood that the existing character be preserved while housing efforts move forward.

Address Community Needs in Housing Maintenance and Upgrades

Supporting ADA improvements, remediation efforts, and green upgrades to homes will help create housing that is both more affordable (from things like decreasing energy and water bills) and meets the needs of residents. Supporting everyday maintenance such as lawn upkeep and minor repairs will help homeowners avoid needing more support later on.

Increase Responsible Landlords

Nearly half of Eastside residents rent. Residents expressed and prioritized a need for better landlords and safer housing conditions for renters.

HAPPENING NOW


Some work toward these goals is already happening with the Kalamazoo County Land Bank's small home project on Phelps. The project will re-establish lost housing stock and include high quality natural elements and art.

Eastside Housing By the Numbers





Connectivity

VISION: Eastside is a neighborhood that is easy to navigate at any time of day with infrastructure that is comfortable and safe to use.

Create or Install Safe and Accessible Infrastructure (sidewalks, crosswalks, curb ramps)

The ultimate goal is to have sidewalks that serve all of Eastside. Residents prioritized locations that are either amenities or the streets that are the easiest connections to the bus system and other parts of the City.

Eastside Sidewalk Conditions

In the fall of 2017, a class from Kalamazoo College analyzed neighborhood completeness as defined by IK2025 in Eastside. They found that:

- 85% of Eastside is covered by sidewalks
- 31% of existing sidewalks are damaged or difficult to pass over



Improve Lighting throughout the Neighborhood

Improving lighting will increase the sense of safety in the neighborhood at night. Lighting leading to St. Mary's, East Main, and bus stops were the focus areas identified through engagement. In more residential areas, smaller, pedestrian scale lights were something residents would like to explore further.



Implement Streetscaping/ Complete Street Treatments on Main Corridors and Slow Traffic on Neighborhood Streets


Eastside would like to invest in the commercial corridors to make them safer, more welcoming, and appealing. By implementing traffic calming and bike infrastructure along E. Main, Riverview, and the southeast corner of the neighborhood, the commercial corridors will be improved. It will also be easier for residents to access downtown and other parts of the City when using non-motorized transportation.

HAPPENING NOW

Metro is currently working on a study of bus stops. This study should be complete fall of 2018 and will inform signage, stop location, and shelter location.

Improve Bus Stops (signage, shelters, lighting, benches, etc.)

Eastside has many access points to bus service. Installing shelters, benches, and/or signs that provide service information will make using the bus easier and more appealing for residents.

Improve After School Opportunities

Increase Greenspace, Tree Canopy, and Address Other Environmental Issues (increase the sustainability and environmental friendliness of neighborhood)



Enhance and Connect Neighborhood Parks and Trails

A large portion of the neighborhood is within walking distance to parks. The western portion of the neighborhood's access to the parks within walking distance is hindered by barriers including crossing heavy traffic and passing under the train overpass. Access to parks for Eastside residents can be greatly increased by addressing these barriers and creating more connections.



VISION: Eastside is served by two vibrant and welcoming commercial corridors that support local businesses while meeting the needs of residents.

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
Redevelop Commercial Corridors (E. Main and Riverview)
