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Introduction

During the Imagine Kalamazoo 2025 (IK2025) planning process, neighborhood plans were identified as a need. Neighborhood plans allow the neighborhood to focus on their neighborhood vision and realize the community's Strategic Vision with small-scale or focused planning work. This resident driven process allows neighborhoods to take control of their future. The neighborhood planning process as laid out in the 2025 Master Plan does not have a required focus beyond aligning with the Strategic Vision and 2025 Master Plan goals. Through this process residents are encouraged to think about everything that impacts their daily wellbeing and futures. The resulting plans are comprehensive and leverage collaboration to achieve results.

The Vine Neighborhood is the oldest and most central of the neighborhoods. It is south of downtown, east of Western Michigan University and west of Bronson Methodist Hospital. In total, Vine is approximately 1 square mile in size. Vine Neighborhood has a population of approximately 5,572 (Esri Business Analyst, 2017), and is one of the most dense neighborhoods in the City.



1840s:

Earliest homes were built in Vine Neighborhood. Much of the population consisted of Dutch immigrants. These immigrants worked long days in the mucky fields, growing and harvesting celery. Kalamazoo eventually gained the nickname "Celery City".

Pre-Depression 1900s:

Leading up to the Great Depression, housing demands rose – fueled by blue-collar workers and students of Western Michigan University (which had developed just west of Vine). Large lots were subdivided and many older homes were moved to those now divided lots, leaving room for new construction.

Early 1900s:

Vine was one of the most desirable neighborhoods in the city. It was close to the downtown business district and local churches. Kalamazoo's Public School was located here, bringing in students areawide. During this time, Kalamazoo College got its start in Vine.

Depression Era (1929-1941):

During the Depression, larger homes were broken into apartments for boarders. The influx of rental funds helped supplement income for struggling families. 1940s – 1960s:

Suburbanization took its toll on Vine Neighborhood; many families and workers moved with jobs to the outskirts of the city. The neighborhood lost much of its stable population.

1970s - 1980s:

Western Michigan University expanded its campus, providing new apartments and residence halls for students. Many of the students that had been living in Vine left the neighborhood. This freed space for new groups of residents to move into the area. Around this time, residents joined together to form the Vine Neighborhood Association. They hoped to improve their neighborhood and guide its future development.

1980s - Present:

The Vine Neighborhood Association and related groups have been largely successful in improving quality of life in the neighborhood as well as relationships between Vine and City departments. The area now hosts families, students, young professionals, and retirees. It also attracts visitors from outside of the neighborhood, who enjoy the culinary and cultural offerings of the many restaurants, theaters, and shops.

Neighborhood Planning Process



Review previous plans & engagement

In January 2018, Vine launched a survey to learn more about what people like best about Vine and where they saw room for improvement. This survey feedback, combined with the Vine Village Plan as well as Vine Neighborhood IK2025 input, established a clear starting point for discussions.

Engage community to create neighborhood vision

Vine brought together a group of businesses, organizations, and residents to serve as their coalition. The coalition had their first meeting in February to help clarify common themes that had been pulled from previous engagement as well as inform what work was already being done in those areas. In February 2018, Vine Neighborhood Association held a community meeting, with nearly 60 residents in attendance, to confirm priorities with residents, share information on the efforts happening in the area, and provide an opportunity for residents to give input on new ideas. Topics discussed at this meeting included zoning,





parks & gardens, walkability, on-street parking, defining Vine, and 2018 construction projects. Vine also held focus group meetings to dive deeper into topics that weren't discussed at the community meeting, but were identified as topics that needed to be discussed at that meeting. Focus groups provided help on the topics of housing and youth.


Draft goals & neighborhood plan

Combining all past information and plans, as well as new input heard from residents at the February community meeting, goals and actions were drafted. The goals were drafted to be Specific, Measurable, Achievable, Realistic, and Timely (S.M.A.R.T.) and align with the Strategic Vision. The goals and actions were then structured into a draft of the neighborhood plan.

Confirm goals & neighborhood plan

Through pop up engagement at neighborhood events and an online survey, Vine residents were able to give feedback on the plan goals to confirm that the goals are what the community wants and to identify anything that might be missing. During the September Art Hop in the Vine, residents had the opportunity to review and celebrate the draft plan.





Neighborhood plan goes to Planning Commission

Once the goals and Imagine Vine Neighborhood Plan are finalized by Vine, the plan will go to the Planning Commission to seek approval as an amendment to the Imagine Kalamazoo 2025 Master Plan.

Complete action steps to turn the vision into reality!

After the plan is approved, Vine neighborhood, the City, and other partners will get to work on carrying out the actions in the plan starting with a Quick Win Project.

Create a Stable Supply of Affordable Housing


Vine seeks to implement tools and programs that will create a stable and affordable housing supply for residents.

Develop Tools to Assist Property Owners in Understanding, Navigating, and Funding Maintenance or Improvements to Their Homes; Including Historic Structures and Energy Efficiency

Vine is mostly covered by historic districts. While this is an asset to the neighborhood, it is also challenging for residents to navigate the process to make improvements as well as afford improvements. Vine seeks to increase awareness of existing tools and programs, and create new programs and tools that will support residents in making improvements and performing maintenance in their homes.

Affordability in Vine

Median household income in Vine is \$22,359. A general rule of thumb is that housing should cost no more than 30% of its annual income. Therefore, a person with an income of \$22,359 could afford to pay approximately \$559 on rent each month. There are some rental units available at this price, but the majority exceeds \$1,000 (based on Zillow February 2018).

Using the median home value in Vine, \$89,483, and assuming a 10% down payment and 30- year fixed mortgage, it was calculated that a monthly mortgage payment would be \$623. This too exceeds the 30% affordability threshold. (MSU student calculations)








Continue to Build and Maintain a Sense of Community in the Neighborhood and Neighborhood Safety

Improve Sidewalk Conditions to Help Promote Greater Walkability

Though Vine is almost completely covered with sidewalks, several of those sidewalks are in great disrepair and are difficult to pass over in a wheelchair or with a stroller. Making repairs to the sidewalk system and the installation of safe crossings in key locations is one of the top priorities for Vine residents.

Improve Neighborhood Safety Through Street Lighting

To increase the walkability and safety in Vine, residents would like to see more lighting. It is important to residents that the lighting does not produce excess light pollution in the neighborhood.

Slow Traffic Along Major Corridors

Vine has a number of very busy, fast moving streets that cut through the neighborhood. Residents would like to see traffic slowed and the pedestrian prioritized, particularly at key locations such as the neighborhood commercial node, schools, and parks.

Create Uniform and Easy to Understand Parking Regulations

Vine neighborhood has 22 different parking regulations. This can be confusing and difficult to navigate for residents and visitors. Residents would like to see a uniform and comprehensive approach to parking in the neighborhood.




Improve the Neighborhood Connectivity to the Rest of Kalamazoo

Residents would like to see more infrastructure for bikes, particularly north south connections, and improved bus stops. This will help residents access other parts of the City and for Kalamazoo residents to more easily access Vine.
